In April, we were lucky enough to receive a visit from the Easter Bunny. On Palm Sunday, we welcomed Mr. Cottontail to celebrate the coming of Easter with us and our children, complete with good food, some dancing, an Egg Hunt, and plenty of fellowship. It was a joyful Sunday as we celebrated the coming of God's kingdom and the hope of Easter. Yet none were quite so joyful as my sister, Haley.

Haley, who is close personal friends with the Bunny (wink wink), has, in the past year, made the moves to open her own mascoting business - Haley's Party Creatures. She's acquired several mascot costumes using her savings from her jobs at Chick-Fil-A and Busch Gardens and is in the midst of setting up her website to officially launch.

This is a big deal for her and our whole family. Haley's passion has always been mascotting. Even when we were little kids, she was always intrigued by mascots and jumped at her first chance to be one in Middle School. This has been a calling she had her entire life, and it is a gift to see her step into this calling on her own terms in this unique way.

For a while, Haley did not believe any of this would be possible for her. She has a disability, and between bullying she faced in high school and a combination of adults outside our family who did not believe her capable of much, she began to see her own body as an enemy and an obstacle. It has been heartbreaking to watch her wrestle with that, and it's sad to say that it's something she still grapples with to this day.

And yet, while fighting this mental battle with herself, she has accomplished something so special. We are all tremendously proud of her, and I'm telling y'all this story, so you can share in that pride even as we recognize that some complicated emotions come alongside it.

My sister has Williams Syndrome, a rare disorder caused by genetic mutation. People with Williams typically look like Haley does, and they often struggle with math and spatial relations. They feel emotions on a broader spectrum than we dotheir joys are beyond what we can imagine, but their pains and griefs are, too. They are hyper-social and crave friendships and connection more than your average human. And they hear music differently than we do. When we hear music, 20-30% of our brain activates, but when they hear it, it's like 70-80% of theirs, so music is a completely different, all-encompassing experience for them.

Most people don't know much about Williams, so in May, we observe Williams Syndrome awareness month, a time to tell the stories of my sister and other people with Williams - a time to share the good, bad, and challenging of living with Williams. As such, I've shared her story with you. Thank you for reading, and thank you for welcoming my sister into this church with open arms and deep kindness. Your welcoming hearts impact more than you know.

May that welcome only expand.


New Adult Sunday School Class 9:00 am in the Library John Steinmetz



What is Outreach? This is a test of your Outreach knowledge:

Many of you think Outreach is all about providing food. You get partial credit for that answer ***once a month church members provide dinners for 15-20 homeless kids at the Beach ***Winter Shelter provides meals and a place to sleep for the homeless. We prepared food for 125 people and served it the Saturday after thanksgiving. Five members prepared the food and 25 people helped to serve it. The youth set the tables for all.

***JCOC dinners are prepared by church volunteers for 125 people.

This happens twice a year. Thanks Debbie Ivory
***2500-3000 Beach Bags of food are assembled each fall.

About 40 VBCC members help with this project. Thank you Nancy Watters

***125 Beach Bags were assembled by the Disciple Women for Horizons summer
camp ***Youth delivered and stocked a food pantry with food donated by church
members ***Members deliver Meals on Wheels one week every month ***Monthly
deliveries are made with paper bags, toiletries and food to a local food pantry. Until
recently egg cartons were also delivered to Beach Babies

If you answered that Outreach provides clothing, you would get partial credit.

***Clothing gifts for teens were placed under the Christmas tree. Over 40 hoodies as well as numerous jackets, scarves, hats and mittens were provided to teens identified by Social Services as needy ***Delivery of clothes to Norfolk Jewish Temple clothes center

If you said Outreach provided space, you get more partial credit.

***We provide space for the Great Neck Preschool ***AA ***NA ***Grief Group ***Braille Children's Camp ***Red Cross Blood Drive annually

If you think that's all Outreach does, you've forgotten some of the other miscellaneous things ***VBCC proves storage for the Interfaith Alliance at the Beach furniture ministry. Thanks Robertsons ***Disciple Women provided Christmas in July for the residents at Luther Manor ***Disciple Women reading to first graders at Horizons' Teddy Bear Tea ***Disciple Women provided and assembled 78 bags of personal items for Church World Service International Code Red project ***Members provided enough plastic for three recycle benches.
