Participant will follow Sitting Bulls journey from Little Bighorn to exile at Wood Mountain, Saskatchewan to his last days at Fort Yates, Standing Rock, during which they will question History, Place, and Theology.

Limited to seven (7) participants. Each will enhance the journey by choosing a background study: Geology, Law, Christian Theology, Art, Business, Government, or Lakota Spirituality.

The journey begins in Billings, Montana on Wednesday July 15 and ends seven days later when returning to Billings from Wood Mountain, Saskatchewan.

Most of the trip is in the rural landscape of the northern prairies. Participants should be comfortable with camping (bringing you own tent and sleeping bag).

Winter Talk is an important time for American Indians and non-Indians, to gather and eat, learn, and talk about the impact of the Christian Doctrine of Discovery. This is a space of accountability to American Indians where the Indian voice is the principle voice in an exploration of the past, an understanding of the present, and a visioning of the future.
