The chaplains at the Hampton VA recently hosted a workshop in VA S.A.V.E. and Building Spiritual Strength. Both of these programs are geared toward veterans who are living with PTSD (understood as both Stress Disorder and Spiritual Distress). Among the many take home moments for me was the conversation around spiritual/values distress. When we live in two (or more) systems that have differing values/moral codes that are at odds with each other we often feel the tension. This tension can lead to a crisis and even a break. A small way might experience this ourselves, or others, is the comment about the church being full of hypocrites. There is an expected way of being in connection with a life of faith and there are the ways of being that are expected out of church. When the two pull on each other there is the possibility of soul distress.

Be kind and acknowledge where someone is at, don't reinforce the feelings or behaviors, but be present in the moment.

TO PONDER...

When researchers for the American Bible Society's annual *State of the Bible* report saw this year's survey statistics, they found it hard to believe the results. The data said roughly 26 million people had mostly or completely stopped reading the Bible in the last year... When people are not in church, they're not reminded of the blessings of Scripture and its importance for their lives. And they aren't encouraged by other Christians sharing about their own Bible reading.

Cultural Protestantism could exist, even look similar to its radical form, just without the dialectic [discussing truth of opinions]. Without its dialectic, Protestantism is a particularly flat and vapid form of religion, absent even bells and smells. But to have its safe place in the immanent frame, Protestantism needed to forget (even dislike) the confession that life is found in death, grace in judgment, community in confession, justification in sinners, and that being lost is the only way to be found.



Breakfast, Brunch, Holiday

Creme Brulée French Toast Casserole

- an easy make-ahead breakfast



Preparation Time: 20 minutes Cook Time: 40 minutes Servings: 10

1 whole french bread loaf, cut in 2-inch squares 8 large egg, whole 2 1/4 cups milk 1 cup sugar 4 tablespoons sugar 1/4 teaspoon salt 2 tablespoons vanilla extract 1 tablespoon Grand Marnier, optional 1/4 cup orange juice 2 teaspoons cinnamon 3 tablespoons butter

Combine eggs, milk, 1 cup sugar, salt, 1 tsp. cinnamon, vanilla, Grand Marnier, orange juice, and 2 tbsp. melted butter in a large bowl. Whisk together until well incorporated.

Use remaining butter to heavily butter a 9x13 baking pan.

Slice bread into 1" thick slices and then cut slices into cubes. Combine remaining cinnamon and 1 tbsp. sugar. Add bread cubes to pan and toss with cinnamon sugar mixture. Pour custard mixture over bread cubes, pressing cubes down with a spoon to thoroughly soak bread. Cover with foil and refrigerate at least one hour or overnight.

Preheat oven to 325° F. Bake approximately 40-50 minutes until golden brown and set.

Remove from the oven and sprinkle remaining 3-4 tbsp. of sugar over the top of the casserole.

Set broiler on high and return to oven or use a kitchen torch to caramelize the sugar. The sugar will turn brown and liquefy and then harden as it cools. Serve warm with maple syrup if desired.

This is the perfect make-ahead baked French toast casserole. Overnight French toast is perfect for a weekend bunch or a busy holiday

morning. Wake up and throw it in the oven — breakfast is done!
