Growing up, I was a competitive dancer - a very committed competitive dancer. Because of this, through the spring and summer, my family spent anywhere between six and eight weekends away at dance competitions, where I would compete, along with 30 other girls from my dance studio, in group pieces, solo numbers, duets, trios, and what not against other studios from across the East Coast. Think 'Dance Moms,' but less intense.

My best solo was a jazz dance to Pat Benatar's hit, "Hit Me With Your Best Shot." I love rock'n'roll, so it was my kind of music, and the dance itself was perfectly suited to my talents and skills.

I competed that solo for two years. I knew it backwards and forwards. I could tell you every beat and note of that music to this day. Yet it never received the coveted "platinum" award, the highest grade given in competitive dance. I always found myself with "high gold" or "triple gold," which are the dance competition equivalent of B+ or A- when I was in pursuit of an A.

There was one competition where I had a real shot at platinum. I was hitting every beat; every trick was flying with ease. I knew this was the best I had ever danced the solo.

I got to the final thirty seconds, and there was a move - arguably the easiest move in the dance, the part where I was supposed to catch my breath before the rest. I was to pop myself out into my splits on the floor, hold the pose, then roll out of it and stand up

Well, I popped out into my splits, and immediately fell forward onto my face. I recovered quickly, and I finished the dance with the same practiced ease and groove I had been celebrating before the face plant. And then I sat backstage awaiting the award ceremony wondering if my recovery would be enough.

It was not enough. I received yet another high gold. My momentary lapse was enough to knock me down a whole score. Though dancers have much grace, there is very little grace in their grading.

How fortunate are we that momentary lapses are not met with such condemnation by our God. That God has unparalleled grace and can forgive even the largest of mistakes.

With God, there are only two grades: well done and not done. Let us remember and recover from our mistakes, seeking to dance as well as we can in our Lord's service, grateful that God extends grace to us as we recover and mindful that we dance as God leads.

Beach Bags Food Drive Packing Blitz! July 7, following Sunday Church


Each weekend bag, called Beach Bags, includes ten items for each child to help the food insecure child get through the weekend.




